INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS: STUDENTS SURVEY RESULTS

REFERENCE PERIOD:

From November 2019 to February 2020

AIM:

To study the *International Business* students' the opinion on study modules their quality, and teaching.

QUESTIONNAIRE:

Students studying at International Business study programme evaluated the quality of study modules according to 17 criteria. Rating scale: *Strongly Agree; Agree; Neither Agree nor Disagree; Disagree; Strongly Disagree.* Forty-three completed questionnaires were received.
